Leavers' Assembly

Leavers assembly will be held on the morning of Monday 24th June. Pupils should attend school in full uniform and will start their day in form groups. They will then attend their leavers assembly and have plenty of time for shirt signing and photos.

Leaving Date

You will be given advance notice of Year 11's commencement of study leave. All the year group will be placed on study leave at the same time. Hoodies will be distributed on their 'last day.' School will operate a study room for students who will not be able to get home before the end of normal school closing time.

Contingency Day

Wednesday 26th June is the GCSE examination contingency day. Should anything go wrong either locally or nationally with a paper, it could be rescheduled on that day. Please do not book holidays before this date.

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New Behaviour Policy

If a behavioural issue should arise in a lesson, it is expected that the member of staff follows the school 5 stage model:

- Stage 1: The teacher will give you a first warning.
- **Stage 2**: The teacher will give you a second warning and you may be asked to move seats or change groups to help you re-focus.
- **Stage 3:** The teacher will then ask you to stand outside the classroom to REFLECT on your behaviour. This will be your last opportunity to make a positive choice before you are removed from the classroom.
- **Stage 4:** The teacher will give you a yellow card. At this point, you need to remain outside the classroom and wait for a member of staff to collect you. You will be taken to a different classroom for the rest of the lesson. A yellow card detention will be issued (25 minutes).
- **Stage 5:** If you fail a yellow card (Failure to remain outside the classroom, Failure to go to the removal room or Truanting), you will be given a red card. You will be placed in RESET for 2 periods and 1 social time.

New Detentions Explained

- **Late Detention** = 10 minutes break or lunch detention.
- **Yellow Card Detention** = 25 minutes lunch or after school detention.
- **DTL Detention** = 45 minute after school detention.
- **Smart Card Detentions** = 25 minutes after school Failure to attend will result in a HOY/SLT Detention.
- **Head of Year / SLT Detention** = 1 hour after school every Thursday Failure to attend with result in the student being in RESET until 4:30 the following day.

*All detentions will be set via Arbor, and you will be able to see when they are and who they are with via Arbor. Any issues with Arbor or setting up Arbor please contact the school.

Y9 Psychology Experiment

Y9 completed an experiment to see if there is a relationship between personality and licking ability.

They completed a psychological profile (Eysenck Personality Questionnaire) to generate a score in relation to how introverted or extroverted their personalities are. They then tested their licking ability by sucking on a lemon and timed themselves to see how many times they could lick a piece of



paper in one min. Results were then analysed to determine if correlation exists between personability and lickability.
