Exam Results


The cohort of 2023 at Moorside provided some excellent results this year with 64% of pupils achieving grades 9-5 in English (a strong pass) and 77% achieving grades 9-4. Impressively, 15% of pupils received grades 9-7 In Maths, 11% of pupils scored the highest grades 9-7, 46 % received the strong passes of grades 9-5 and 67% got grades 9-4. Our entry for the EBaccaluareate continues to remain high at 70% ensuring the pupils receive a broad and balanced curriculum.


Key achievements for the cohort were that one pupil achieved 6 grade 9s, and 3 achieved 10 grade 7s and above. Amazing academic success! We are pleased that so many pupils have now begun exciting new opportunities including A levels, T levels and other vocational courses ranging from animal care to performing arts. One pupil has now started a BTEC course in Marine Biology and Ecology in Falmouth, another an Aviation related course at the Manchester College and one doing Hospitality and Catering at the University College Birmingham. We have many who have begun apprenticeships in Business Administration, Equine and plumbing, as a multi skilled engineer at Elke's Biscuits, a teaching assistant at St. Bartholomew's Primary School which was secured after a successful work experience placement and Construction with Taylormade Construction.

Year 11 Exam Masterclass

On Tuesday, all Year 11 students were visited by Martin from Exams Made Easy. He explained how revision can be completed effectively and gave them helpful tips for exam success. All students engaged

with the session; Mrs Morley was especially impressed with Riley B and Mrs Stokes thought that Keisha L was a shining example of our REACH values. This session has allowed them to hit the ground running in their final year.







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
