## Thank You


We have received the following message regarding our recent non-uniform fundraising for Brain Tumour Research.

Our family would like to thank all those who have contributed to the MHS dressing down day in November for the Brain Tumour Research charity. Brain tumours kill more children and adults under the age of 40 than any other cancer yet they receive just 1% of the national spend on cancer research. The direct cause of a brain tumour is still not clear and there are over 120 different types. An estimated 16,000 people are diagnosed each year with this disease. Emma was diagnosed with a stage 4 Glioblastoma on Xmas Eve. She endured 3 operations, chemotherapy, and radiotherapy but the cancer being very aggressive, eventually took her life just 12 months later. Thank you for helping to find that elusive cure and preventing another family from heartache. Your support has been awesome.
