Well done to all our wonderful winners, and a big thank you to the Science Department for giving the students such wonderful opportunities to develop and demonstrate their excellence.



If your child would like to come on this the trip, please complete the parental consent form (sent out digitally) and pay via ParentPay ASAP.


### School of Rock: The Musical


