## From the Head Teacher

This week Year 8 and 11 students are experiencing both ends of the GCSE process. Year 8 students will start their options processes next week with a dedicated day on Challenge Day. Year 11 students received their mock exam results day this week, which included meeting colleges and FE providers to assess their next steps.

For both groups it is a time of reflection to look at where they are in their journey and make important decisions about how they will commit their time to achieve their goals. For Year 11, this involves entering the next phase of their exam preparation, identifying, and closing gaps before their final exams in June. For Year 8, it is about looking beyond school and considering which options will give them the best choices and opportunities later in life.

I am excited to share with you that we are increasing the number of options that students can choose and the breadth of subjects that we will offer. There will be more on this to come.

In assemblies, we have revisited our motto, Engage and Achieve, and asked students to reflect on how they apply themselves and use time effectively. We discussed **this clip** from Steven Bartlett and worked out the cumulative impact of committing 20-minutes a day to revision for Key Stage 4 or the learning of a new skill for Key Stage 3. I would encourage you to ask your child about this.

### Les Alpes


