The basic equipment your child should bring to school each day includes:

- A pen (black or blue)
- A pencil
- A reading Book
- A calculator (for mathematics and science)
- Highlighter
- Ruler, protractor, and eraser
- Laptop (Students in Key Stage 3)
- Smartcard

Any specific equipment required for practical subjects (e.g., art supplies, PE kit)
